## Senior Health Matters The Secrets of a Longer Life

New data from the Global Burden of Disease Study has revealed it is our own behavior that is the greatest threat to our staying alive. Poor diet is the number one risk factor, followed by high blood pressure and smoking. A poor quality diet was a bigger cause of death than obesity itself but it may well be that the obesity component will be the most important factor in the future. It was behind more than 19% of all deaths worldwide and almost 70% of coronary heart disease deaths in 2017. A diet high in sodium was the most common cause of death.

Professor John Newton, a collaborator on the project stated, "People are eating too many calories, they are having too much fat and carbohydrates in their diet and they are not taking enough exercise."

Non-communicable diseases such as cancer and diabetes now account for  $\frac{3}{4}$  of the 55.9 million deaths worldwide, many of which are unnecessarily early. Lung cancer is the most common cancer causing death.




## 2019 Detroit Auto Show



On Wednesday, January 2, 2019 at 10:30AM, we will discuss "Sapiens: A Brief History of Humankind," by Yuval Harari. In "Sapiens," Dr. Harari spans the whole of human history. Bold, wide-ranging, and provocative, Sapiens explores the origins of our beliefs in gods, nations, and human rights, and why we adopted such fundamental societal institutions as money, books, and laws. *The Guardian* writes, "It really is thrilling and breathtaking; it actually does question our basic narrative of the world." Rich Schreck will lead the discussion.

On Monday, January 21 at 3:00PM we will discuss the acclaimed novel "War and Turpentine," by Stefan Hertmans. In this *New York Times* Top 10 Best Book of the Year, a Flemish writer tries to piece together the life story of his grandfather, who was the child of a lowly church painter, a foundry worker who narrowly escaped death, a soldier in World War I, a man married to his true love's sister, and a veteran haunted by war and his frustrated dreams of life as an artist. *The Economist* describes this book as, "A lovingly reimagined life of an ordinary man... forever marked by the first world war." George Stern will lead the discussion.
